Tsleil-Waututh Nation Announces the Premiere of their New Feature Film:
People of the Inlet

NORTH VANCOUVER

Tsleil-Waututh (Slayl-wah-tuth) Nation meaning, "The People of the Inlet", is a progressive First Nation whose traditional lands include spectacular forest areas, glacier-capped mountain peaks, productive salmon streams, and the dense urban settlement of Vancouver. Many Tsleil-Waututh people currently live in the community that is located on the north shore of Burrard Inlet within the Seymour region.

The hour long feature film, *People of the Inlet*, showcases several of Tsleil-Waututh Nation's ground-breaking achievements. The film highlights Tsleil-Waututh's land and water stewardship activities, innovative economic development initiatives and the ongoing celebration and expression of Tsleil-Waututh cultural practices.

The Deep Cove Heritage Society is partnering with Tsleil-Waututh Nation to host a public screening of the film to the wider community. The Premiere will take place on Monday November 22th at 7:00 pm at the Tsleil-Waututh Nation Community Centre. Admission will be by donation.
